The annual convention project usually
benefits a cause in the sponsoring
region. Region X is expanding its project
to the schools in eastern NC affected by
Hurricane Florence, a generous and
thoughtful outreach, Fund\$ for Florence.

One of the proposed amendments, based
on action at the International Convention,
is to make collegiate membership part of
the membership classifications in the
Bylaws. The Finance Committee will
make the proposal for dues for that group
to be \$5.00.

Other changes include that dues for the
2019-2020 year must be collected in
June. Our chapter will revise the
installment form and send immediately
after convention so it reflects any dues
increases. Installments will be due in
May and June.
