


Pictured above is Sherricka Stanley and her family early voting. Sherricka's son was a FIRST time Primary Voter.

SCHOOLS FOR AFRICA EVERY CHILD DESERVES A QUALITY EDUCATION

As of 2017, 64 million children of primary school age were out of school, up from just under 61 million in 2012. 54 percent of these children live in sub-Saharan Africa.

Those children who are in school do not always receive a quality education. In sub-Saharan Africa, approximately 50 per cent of the population is under the age of 18. This presents a unique opportunity to leverage the skills, resources and capacities of millions of children and adolescents, and support even greater progress and new growth opportunities for them and the societies in which they live.

Schools for Africa is a partnership among UNICEF, Peter Krämer Stiftung and the Nelson Mandela Foundation, that is helping millions of children access a quality education.
