BEST NC established a teacher recruitment working group to help develop a set of recommendations and impactful teacher recruitment strategies for North Carolina.

Breg has over 25 years of experience as a business owner, public policy professional, and education advocate, Brenda leads the overall BEST NC vision, strategy, and operations while leveraging her expertise to be the business-to-education bridge in BEST NC's work to transform education in North Carolina. 

Marketing DKG Within/Beyond the Society

Info below is adapted excepts from p.52-53 of The Delta Kappa Gamma Bulletin Collegial Exchange

Marketing DKG within and beyond the Society requires knowing the facts.

Who is DKG? Create a list of who needs what DKG has to offer.

What are the benefits of DKG? Financial assistance/discounts, a showcase for one's work, attendance/participation in professional and personal growth opportunities, a network for personal and professional fellowship, and service and advocacy community and educational forums.

When is the time to market DKG? ANY TIME is the time to market DKG. Be persistent, consistent, and untiring!

Where is the place to market DKG? Any place is the place to market DKG.

Why DKG? Walk yourself through the Mission, Vision, and Puposes of DKG to reacquaint yourself with the essence of the Society.

How to market DKG? Two categories: initial marketing strategies and follow-up marketing strategies.

Personal Contact	Contact a student teacher within your educational institution and share your DKG story.
Community Presence	Set up a table at the district's "New Teacher Orientation" to market the local DKG chapters.
Tokens of Encouragement	Provide care packages to a local school throughout the year to encourage educators and market DKG.
Invitations to DKG Events/Gatherings	Sponsor "Meet and Greet" informal gatherings to allow the "who" to see and hear the "what" and "why" of DKG.
Use of the DKG Membership Plan (*provided on the DKG website)	Read, personalize, and implement the plan in an orientation session with the "who."
Follo	w-Up Marketing Strategies
"Meet and Greet"	Pair current members with "meet and greet" attendees in order to maintain contact with them in whatever way is appropriate.
Award/Grant/Scholarship Recipients	Invite recipients to a meeting/gathering/event to share about their educational pursuits or endeavors. Extend an invitation for membership as appropriate.
Guest Speakers	Invite a local expert to speak at a DKG event; extend membership invitation to the speaker as appropriate.
High School Graduates (recipients of financial assistance)	Follow recipients through their collegiate experiences with tokens of encouragement. Encourage them to write articles for your newsletters. Extend membership invitation as appropriate
